It is time to make your plans for RE-ENROLLMENT!

Early planning will help you prepare your finances so you can get the 20/20 discount. Tuition checks must be included with your form.

At the meeting you will need to update a few other forms. In order for you to complete re-enrollment you will be asked to update:

♦ Medical Record updates provide copies of your child's immunization records that can be left with us. **VERY IMPORTANT!!!!!**

- ☐ Update and initial & date health forms, emergency forms, etc.
- **Verify Student Name** (Important for June Celebration. Check spelling for each of your students' names).

APS has three ways for you to save money on tuition.

Make sure you plan ahead so as to take full advantage of the following three APS benefits: (No pun intended. Well, maybe a little.)

RE-enrollment checks should be submitted at the APRIL workshop.

II eScrip:

50% of eScrip contributions credited to your family*.

III Referral Rewards:

\$10.00* for each new family you refer to APS who completes enrollment.

- Only one APS Referral Reward per new family.
- Referral must be made at time of enrollment.
- An APS Referral Reward form must be submitted with the new family's enrollment form. See form on page 11 or at: www.APS4me.com.
- A Referral Reward for one new family may not be "shared" by multiple APS families.
- Referral Rewards total amount may not exceed a referring family's total yearly tuition.



SAT TESTING



SAT testing for APS students grades 4 -10 will be held May 6 - May 9* IF YOU WANT TEST SCORES BEFORE ORIENTATION

YOU MUST PROVIDE AN **EXTRA SASE** MARKED "**SAT SCORES**".

- * Testing dates: Monday, May 6 through Thursday May 9*
- * Arrival times: 9:00 9:15 a.m.
- * Testing times: 9:30 a.m. to approximately 1:00 PM**
- * Testing location: Church on the Way, East Campus in the Lamb's House.

The first day of testing all families will meet for a general assembly.

The all-purpose general assembly room is upstairs. The meeting will take place before any testing begins. Teacher and room assignments will take place at that time. **BE ON TIME!** Give yourself plenty of time to deal with parking, traffic, etc. We will be testing at Church on the Way, East Campus in the Lamb's House.

No student may come to testing and be left unattended.

At least one parent **MUST BE PRESENT AT ALL TIMES** for each student. Standard parental consent form policy applies. If you are the temporary guardian for any student, please inform the SAT Administrator when you arrive, and make sure you have a valid/signed Temporary Guardian form with you.

Students who are NOT being tested


- 1) May go to the playground equipment **ONLY IF** their parent remains with them.
- 2) If you bring siblings who are not being tested you should **bring snacks and drinks for them**. Please do not take snacks and drinks intended for students who are being tested. Snacks and drinks are **provided ONLY for students being tested**.
- 3) You should also **bring books, school work, coloring materials**, etc for siblings who are not being tested. Your non-testing students must be totally self-sufficient. Bring everything you will need to keep them occupied.

Students who ARE being tested need to have specific things.

- 1) Two sharpened #2 pencils
- 2) Scratch paper (for math segment)
- 3) Calculator students may use calculators on designated portions of the test. (And NOT on other portions)
- 4) Reading book or drawing paper (so that they have something quiet to do in case they finish a test segment early). Make sure you **give your student something to do** if they finish a test before others who are being tested in their group. **Please provide a book, drawing materials, etc. for this purpose.**

^{*}High School students should be able to complete their testing by Wednesday and should not have to come on Thursday. Unforeseen events may require longer testing, so Thursday is be a backup. Be prepared to attend, if instructed to do so.

^{**}Because there is a listening segment of the SAT Test that must be administered one grade at a time, we will try to test that segment at the end of the day and add about 30 minutes on Monday for 4th, 6th and 8th graders and about 30 minutes on Tuesday for the 5th and 7th graders.





News from the planet Bizarro

 $I_{\rm n}$ mid-March, former APS-Mom Vicki Anderholt informed us about the plight of a Christian German family who immigrated to the U.S. seeking political asylum in order to homeschool their children.


Home schooling is unlawful in their native Germany. Though originally granted political refuge in the US in 2010, the family may soon be deported by the Department of Homeland Security. On Monday morning March 19, Conservative media producer Glenn Beck characterized the story as "nothing more un-American than this" in an

interview with the family's lawyer while also vowing to give \$50,000 to the defense.

Uwe and Hannelore Romeike, along with their six children, wanted to homeschool their children in their native country, but were not permitted to do so under German law.

The Evangelical Christian family sought and were Granted political refuge in the U.S. by an immigration judge in 2010, but now the Department of Homeland Security is claiming that German laws banning homeschooling do not violate the family's human rights.

An article in conservative news outlet, *TheBlaze*, explained: U.S. Immigration Judge Lawrence Burman, who granted the Romeike's asylum, said that



According to the Associated Press, however, the Board of Immigration Appeals found Burman's assertion to be erroneous, adding that the actual record did not support "inflammatory suggestion that it is a Nazi-era law."

The Romeike's appeal to the 6th Circuit will hear oral arguments April 23.

"The Obama administration is basically saying there is no right to home school anywhere," Michael Farris, founder of the Home School Legal Defense Association (which is representing the Romeike family) said in a previous interview. "It's an utter repudiation of parental liberty and religious liberty."

"They are trying to send a family back to Germany where they would certainly lose custody of their children," Farris said. "Our government is siding with Germany."

On his Monday morning radio broadcast, Glenn Beck noted that the Romeike's story greatly mirrored that of the earliest American settlers who migrated to America for religious freedom.

"They [Romeikes] did it the right way," said Beck.

"They had their visas. They came here and asked for political asylum. Because if they return to Germany the state will take their children unless they dump them into the system that [goes against their Evangelical values]."

Beck said that the idea of deporting the Romeikes flies in the face of everything that the U.S. stands for. "There is nothing more un-American than this."

He added that every American, not just those who homeschool, should "pay attention to this case."

Farris spoke to Beck on Monday morning to explain the Romeike's case in greater detail, saying that the family is, "right down the center, Evangelical Christians". Farris also said it is "baffling" as to why the administration seems so bent on the Romeike case given that the initial immigration judge ruled in the family's favor.

"Not only are parental rights not valid [to the administration]...nor is religious freedom on an individual basis," Farris said. "They just struck individual liberty out of the equation...they are setting a precedent that is dangerous."

Beck expressed his thanks to Farris for taking on this case that he believes represents a struggle for the individual rights of all Americans. To this end, Beck noted that his charitable organization will be donating \$50,000 to the Romeike's defense fund. Beck donated to the cause and encouraged listeners to join, saying a special section will be set up on the charity's web page for those interested in supporting the family.

"If you believe in individual freedom. This is one of the many steps they [administration] are taking to take away your rights and parent your child...this is an extraordinarily important case."

In the latest incident of anti-gun hysteria to erupt in a school setting, officials at an elementary school in small-town Michigan impounded a third-grader boy's batch of 30 homemade birthday cupcakes because they were adorned with green plastic figurines representing World War Two soldiers.

The school principal branded the militarythemed cupcakes "insensitive" in light of the Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting, reports Fox News Radio.



"It disgusted me," Casey Fountain, the boy's father, told Fox News. "It's vile they lump true American heroes with psychopathic killers."

Fountain explained that his wife had made the cupcakes. His son, Hunter, helped decorate them. The following morning, Fountain's wife brought the treats to the school's front office, where the secretary reportedly remarked favorably on their appearance.

"About 15 minutes later the school called my wife and told her they couldn't serve the cupcakes because the soldiers had guns," Fountain told Fox News. "My wife told them to remove the soldiers and serve the cupcakes anyway — and I believe she may have used more colorful language."

"We're just taking political correctness too far," the angry father added.

In a statement to local media, Schall Elementary School principal Susan Wright Susan Wright doubled down on her school's bold stand against little green men that represent American soldiers.

'These are toys that were commonplace in the past," Wright said. "However, some parents prohibit all guns as toys. In light of that difference, the school offered to replace the soldiers with another item and the soldiers were returned home with the student."

"Living in a democratic society entails respect for opposing opinions," the principal also said. "In the climate of recent events in schools we walk a delicate balance in teaching non-violence in our buildings and trying to ensure a safe, peaceful atmosphere."



This incident is the latest in a growing line of apparent overreactions by school officials to things students have brought to school — or talked about bringing to school, or eaten at school — that are not anything like real guns.

At Genoa-Kingston Middle School in northeast Illinois, a teacher threatened an eighth-grader with suspension if he did not remove his t-shirt emblazoned with the interlocking rifles insignia of the United States Marines. (RELATED: Junior high teacher tells kid to remove Marines t-shirt or get suspended)

At Park Elementary School in Baltimore. Maryland, a student was suspended for two days because his teacher thought he shaped a [pop-tart] strawberry, pre-baked toaster pastry into something resembling a gun.

(RELATED: Second-grader suspended for having breakfast pastry shaped like a gun)

At Poston Butte High School in Arizona, a high school freshman was suspended for setting a picture of a gun as the desktop background on his school-issued computer.

(RELATED: Freshman suspended for picture of gun)

At D. Newlin Fell School in Philadelphia, school officials reportedly yelled at a student and then searched her in front of her class after she was found with a paper gun her grandfather had made for her.

(RELATED: Paper gun causes panic)

In rural Pennsylvania, a kindergarten girl was suspended for making a "terroristic threat" after she told another girl that she planned to shoot her with a pink Hello Kitty toy gun that bombards targets with soapy bubbles.

At Roscoe R. Nix Elementary School in Maryland, a six-year-old boy was suspended for making the universal kid sign for a gun, pointing at another student and saying "pow." That boy's suspension was later lifted and his name cleared.

Lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender literature are included in the California Department of Education's

newest reading list for students K-12 that includes lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender literature, prompting complaints from critics who say a **leftist agenda is being pushed on kids**, the San Jose Mercury News reported.

Controversial topics have been introduced to California students in the past, but this is the first time the state has put forth works celebrated by the Stonewall Book Awards, which since 1971 has recognized LGBT literature, according to the newspaper.

"We have titles in the list for the LGBT community for multiple recommended grade levels," Roxane Fidler, the CDE's education programs consultant, told the newspaper. "There are books from the Stonewall Book Awards, which has not previously been on the list," Fidler said.

The reading list has been met with controversy by those who say it promotes an alternative lifestyle to children at such a young age.

"It's a frightening trend," Sandy Rios, host of a morning radio show on American Family Radio or AFR Talk told the newspaper. "The reading lists are very overtly propagating a point of view that is at odds with most American parents. Leftist educators are advocates of everything from socialism to sexual anarchy. It's very base; it's raping the innocence of our children. "

In the latest sign that America's public schools are in trouble, a 16-year-old student at a public high school in Pittsburgh has accused a teacher of forcing her to perform lap dances for male students in his computer technology class. The Perry Traditional Academy student says the teacher, Michael White, also kissed her on the lips in a classroom.

Police charge that White, 29, also encouraged her to attend a hotel party where the festivities would have included a striptease. The girl declined, she said. However, the criminal complaint against White charges that he later seduced the girl into leaving school without permission and having sex at his house. This occurred at least twice, and the teacher also allegedly plied the teen with alcohol and marijuana.

The teacher has also been accused of touching a 15-year-old student inappropriately.

White's arrest was action-packed. Police said they had to kick his door down because he wouldn't let them in without a warrant.

He has hired criminal defense attorneys to fight the charges against him. They insist he's innocent.

"We have no reason not to be very skeptical of these allegations at this time," Chuck Gallo, an attorney representing White, asserted.

"Let's slow down here," added Blaine Jones, another attorney representing White. "We live in America and he is innocent until if ever proven guilty."

The array of charges against White includes involuntary deviate sexual intercourse, indecent assault, institutional sexual assault of a minor, corruption of minors and selling or furnishing alcohol to minors.

A school district spokeswoman, Ebony Pugh, told reporters that Perry Traditional Academy hired White in August to teach career and technical education.

The school removed him from the classroom "as soon as the district was notified of any inappropriate behavior," Pugh said. [[][]] Source: Fox News

A Massachusetts principal has been criticized for canceling his school's Honors Night, saying it could be 'devastating' to the students who fell short of the grades. David Fabrizio, principal of Ipswich Middle School, notified parents last week of his plan to eliminate the event, writing: "The Honors Night, which can be a great sense of pride for the recipients' families, can also be devastating to a child who has worked extremely hard in a difficult class but who, despite growth, has not been able to maintain a high grade-point average".

Parents disagree with his philosophy.

"It's been a tradition in Ipswich, and you're very proud as a parent to see your child, as well as some of the other children who made, really, some great efforts," Dave Morin, a parent, told Fox News.

Teacher Fired for Porn

Infidelity 'Homework'

ANAHEIM, Calif. – Investigators say a male teacher has been posing as a Southern California girl on Facebook to lure boys into online relationships.





Zachary Reeder, 30, of Orange, was arrested on suspicion of lewd conduct with a child, according to the Irvine Police Department. Stacie Halas, 32, was found unfit to teach eighth-grade science by the Oxnard CA, School District for appearing in pornographic films

The Orange County Register reports that Irvine police arrested 30-year-old Zachary Reeder on suspicion of lewd conduct with a child, possession and distribution of child pornography, and child annoyance.

Police say Reeder convinced the boys to send him sexually explicit photographs of themselves by posing as a young woman.

It's not believed Reeder had any in-person contact with the boys

Investigators are trying to determine if Reeder used his job as a history teacher at Servite High School in Anaheim to target victims.

Servite is a Catholic all-boys school.

Reeder previously taught history at a Christian high school in San Juan Capistrano and coached basketball at a public high school in Irvine California for four seasons. [[[]]]

The Oxnard School District Board of Trustees has revoke a middle school teacher's pay after discovering that she had previously appeared in pornographic films.

Stacie Halas, 32, was found unfit to teach eighth-grade science at Haydock Intermediate School by the Commission on Professional Competence, which ordered her dismissal.

"The ongoing availability of the videos will impede her ability to be an effective teacher, wrote Judge Julie Cabos-Owen.

The board of trustees fired Halas after students discovered the pornographic films she had appeared in, a district spokesman said. [][[]]

 ${\mathcal A}$ teacher at an Arizona elementary school gave her fourth-grade class a homework assignment that alluded to a "situation" of infidelity.

According to ABC 15, students at Playa Del Rey Elementary School in Gilbert were asked to read passages detailing a certain situation. Then, according to the station, the students were asked to describe what is happening and what should be done about it.

One of the questions was about a wife finding another woman's hair clip under her bed, with hair in it that didn't belong to her.

Heather Nicks, whose daughter Kyera McCloskey received the assignment, was not pleased.

"I don't care what age, it's not something that the school should bring up to my daughter," Nicks told the station.

Nicks alerted the teacher, who quickly emailed parents apologizing for the **adult-themed homework**. She explained that she hadn't actually read the entire assignment.

Still, Kyera completed the assignment, suggesting that the husband had cheated and was in big trouble.

A second-grader was suspended from his public elementary school for playing an imaginary game he calls "Rescue The World". He played the game during recess and broke a key school rule of 'no weapons, real or *imaginary*,' when he tossed an imaginary grenade. He also made the sound, 'pshhh,' to indicate that the imaginary device detonated. He made no threats and was playing the imaginary game by himself.

Alex Watkins,7, who attends Mary Blair Elementary in Loveland, said he was playing the game "Rescue The World." In the game he plays the role of a heroic American soldier out to rid the world of an evil threat.

His duties led him to throw the imaginary grenade into a box he pretended contained evil forces. No one was in the box.

The school has a list of 'absolutes' that states no weapons, even if they're imaginary. A phone call Tuesday morning from FoxNews.com to the school was not returned.

"Honestly, I don't think the rule is very realistic for kids this age," Mandie Watkins, Alex's mom, told reporters. "I think that when a child is trying to save the world, I don't think he should be punished for it." Alex, for his part, told the station that he can't believe he got "dispended."
